
a millstone were hanged about his neck, and that he were drowned in the depth of the sea." God takes the raising and nourishing of children very seriously.



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children God's Word. Every child needs a set of principles to live by. They need to learn respect, integrity, honesty, and discipline. These attributes can only be learned if we, as parents, are teaching them God's Word.

O Be Careful Little Eyes What You See What Your Children See Affects Their Heart



The eyes are said to be the most sensitive parts of our body. Eyesight is a precious gift from God! Not only did He make our eyes to see but also to perceive after sight. For example, a child may see a flame from a candle but he may have to touch it before learning that it will hurt him. Then, the next time he sees the flame, his mind will perceive that it is not something he wants to touch! With some of our children, it took more than one time!

If our eyes are most
sensitive

to physical light and pain, how much more are they sensitive to what enters into the heart. Proverbs 7:2 says, "Keep my commandments, and live; and my law as the apple of thine eye." "The apple of your eye" is a phrase that means, "Something, but usually someone, who is cherished above all others." Although we know that keeping the law does not bring salvation, it does show us our need for salvation through Christ (Galatians 3:24). How are our children and grandchildren going to know they need a Saviour if they do not know they are sinners? The law shows us that we have sinned.

In this day of pluralism and humanism, it is important that we teach our children the commandments of God. The Ten Commandments are a good start but there are hundreds more in the Old Testament alone! Jesus summed up all the commandments when He said, "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy

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CHARACTER COUNTS

Attentive



The above character strip illustrating the character trait “attentive” comes from 4th Edition Word Building PACE 1083. A.C.E. defines attentive, one of sixty character traits of Christ used in the curriculum, as “demonstrating that the person is deserving by giving genuine courtesy and consideration to God’s Word or a person’s words.”

Attentive has synonyms like observant, alive, alert, awake, regardful, mindful, heedful, watchful, careful, and thoughtful. The Bible clearly directs Believers to be attentive in every area of our lives, which includes studying God’s Word. Hebrews 2:1 states, “Therefore we ought to give the more earnest heed to the things which we have heard, lest at any time we should let them slip.”

In the character strip, Miguel is taking notes and being very attentive to the pastor’s sermon. The next morning the students are given an assignment to explain the truth given in the previous night’s sermon. Miguel realizes that because he was very attentive, the assignment will be easier to complete. Being attentive always has positive rewards!

There are many positive Biblical examples of individuals who were attentive. Being attentive typically precedes action in the hearer’s life. Wherever Jesus went, the crowds gathered to HEAR and give ATTENTION to what He was saying. In Luke 19:47–48 the Bible records, “And he [Jesus] taught daily in the temple. But the chief priests and the scribes and the chief of the people sought to destroy him, And could not find what they might do: for all the people were **very attentive to hear him.**” The people were VERY ATTENTIVE to hear Jesus, and so must we be also.

Another example is found in the Old Testament in I Samuel, Chapter 3. Samuel, when a young man, heard a voice calling him at night. He ran to Eli and said, “Here am I,” and Eli said, “I called not.” Again, a voice called Samuel, and he ran to Eli and said, “Here am I.” But Eli said, “I called not.” Eli said to go back to bed, and if he heard the voice again, to say, “Speak, LORD; for thy servant heareth.” The third time Samuel heard a voice and said, “Speak; for thy servant heareth.” God told Samuel he was going to use his life in a special way. His attentive character prepared him to be used by God as a prophet.

Attentive is clearly seen in the parable of the WISE MAN and the FOOLISH MAN. In Matthew 7:24–27 Jesus likens those who hear and heed His words to a wise man who builds his house upon a rock foundation. His house is able to survive the storms. In contrast, the foolish man hears Jesus’ words but chooses not to heed them. The foolish man builds his house upon a shoddy foundation and in the storm is destroyed. Note that both heard Jesus’ words, but only one acted upon them. There is clearly a component of action included in being attentive. Acting upon God’s Word is key to our relationship to the Lord.

May we daily strive to exemplify the character trait “attentive” in our interactions with the students, parents, staff, and our families. May we be attentive in our study of God’s Word and put its truth into active practice in our lives. May God grant the mercy and grace to help us be found attentive and actively pursuing God’s will in our Christian school. *ACE*

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mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets" (Matthew 22:37-40).

Practical Tips

- Post the Ten Commandments in your home.
- Learn and teach the Ten Commandments to your children and grandchildren. There are fun songs available to help you learn them.

- Keep righteousness before their eyes. Take heed to what children watch on TV, play on video games, and read in books. Remember Psalm 101:3, "I will set no wicked thing before mine eyes."
- Talk about God's commandments with your children, and explain their relevance today.

Jeremiah, who wrote Lamentations, said, "Mine eye affecteth mine heart" (Lamentations 3:51a). What our children see does affect their heart. Are you being careful, little eyes? ■

Developing Natural Creativity and Thinking

Children have creative minds and great imaginations. As parents, we have the privilege and awesome responsibility of guiding and developing their natural creativity and thinking. The Literature and Creative Writing course provided by Accelerated Christian Education is an excellent tool to help develop these skills. The student:

- learns verses and Biblical principles from the Book of Proverbs.
- reads wholesome, character-building literature.
- completes a variety of interesting and challenging activities that improve handwriting, increase reading skill, and develop critical thinking.
- learns about and practices writing different types of literature.
- exercises the use of his imagination and creativity.

Each PACE begins with a memory verse from the Book of Proverbs. A poem explains the proverb, and a character strip illustrates the proverb in a situation to which the student easily relates. The Biblical principle of the proverb is explained and emphasized throughout the PACE and the literature book.

Beginning in Level four, the student reads one literature book while completing two PACEs. The literature books for each level include a variety of types: adventure stories, missionary stories, biographies, animal stories, character development, and short stories. Your child is introduced to a variety of authors and literary styles, including some of the classics. Different geographical settings allow him to travel to unfamiliar lands and meet new and interesting people. He observes and learns from the characters as they resolve conflicts with nature, with others, or within themselves. He learns valuable character lessons, which he is encouraged to apply in his own life.

In each PACE, the proverb, the literature book, and the activities are interrelated in an interesting and academically challenging manner. A variety of comprehension and deduction questions check the student's understanding of the proverb and the story. Dictionary and vocabulary activities teach dictionary skills and increase the student's vocabulary as he learns new words from the proverb and the story. Map studies help him visualize the story setting and learn how to follow detailed instructions. He expands his thinking and imagination as he predicts the ending of the story or writes another ending. He learns character lessons about right actions and attitudes. He learns to think logically as he draws accurate conclusions based upon what is true.

Many activities prepare your child for writing creatively. He learns about adjectives, action words, similes, metaphors, and other illustrious words. He uses his five senses to paint mental pictures. He learns how to put his thoughts into word clusters and develop those clusters into creative writing. He is guided systematically as he writes different types of literature: summaries, letters, diaries, sketches, anecdotes, poetry, essays, short stories, and others. By following this step-by-step process, he finds that creative writing is not difficult—it is fun!

Because this course encourages creativity and imagination, some activities are subjective and are evaluated by the supervisor. The supervisor's involvement and encouragement are essential in stimulating critical thinking skills. When used correctly, this core course helps the student learn to think, evaluate, analyze, apply, imagine, and create.

Literature and Creative Writing is a colorful, exciting, academically challenging course that broadens the student's thinking and instills positive character traits for a lifetime. *ACE*
