4. Let's all work together and reduce the spread of germs and illness by respecting everyone.




Guarding Your Heart

What Does It Mean To Guard Your Heart?

Proverbs 4:23-27 instructs believers to, "Keep thy heart with all diligence; for out of it are the issues of life. Put away from thee a froward mouth, and perverse lips put far from thee. Let thine eyes look right on, and let thine eyelids look straight before thee. Ponder the path of thy feet, and let all thy ways be established. Turn not to the right hand nor to the left: remove thy foot from evil."

When we think of our heart in a biblical sense we are talking about the "real" person. Too often we focus on our physical appearance and physical needs, but the physical body is not the "real" me. The "Real" me is known as my soul or heart. Someone once said, "We are not a body with a soul, but a soul with a body."

When Solomon refers to guarding the heart, he really means the inner core of a person, the thoughts, feelings, desires, will, and choices that make that




person who he or she is. The Bible tells us that our thoughts often dictate who we become (Proverbs 23:7; 27:19). The mind of a man reflects who he really is, not simply his actions or words. That is why God examines the heart of a man, not simply his outward appearance and what he appears to be (1 Samuel 16:7).

When God looked down upon man in the days of Noah, He peered beyond the outward to the inner personas well. He said, "And God saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that **every imagination of the thoughts of his heart** was only evil continually." (Genesis 6:5)

Just as there are many diseases and disorders that can affect the physical heart, there are many ailments of the spiritual heart that can impair growth



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and development as a believer. Atherosclerosis is a hardening of the arteries due to accumulated cholesterol plaques and scarring in the artery walls. Hardening of the spiritual heart can also occur. **Hardening of the heart occurs when we are presented with God's truth, and we refuse to acknowledge or accept His truth.**

Egypt was stricken with one plague after another yet Pharaoh refused to release the Israelites from their bondage. He hardened his heart against the truth that God Almighty intended to deliver His people from Egypt (Exodus 7:22; 8:32; 9:34). Well before God hardened Pharaoh's heart, Pharaoh himself hardened his own heart.

In Psalm 95:7–8, King David pleaded with his people not to harden their hearts in rebellion against God as they did in the wilderness. There are many things that can harden the heart and lead a person to deny God, and just like cholesterol blocks blood flow, they keep a believer from having a free flow of God's peace and blessings derived from obedience. **Guarding against a rebellious spirit and cultivating a spirit of submissive obedience to God's Word is the first step in guarding the heart.**

Heart murmurs are abnormal flow patterns due to faulty heart valves. Heart valves act as doors to prevent the backward flow of blood into the heart. Spiritual heart murmurs occur when believers engage

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How To Guard Your Heart



How does God intend for us to live? The book of Proverbs beautifully takes practical matters, interweaves the spiritual, and makes life the beautiful thing God wants it to be. When a person knows God and is right with God, they will find they live a perfectly natural, intensely practical, and deeply spiritual life all at the same time. That's what God intends.

"Keep your heart with all diligence..."

In the Old Testament the word "heart" is used more than 700 times, but more than 200 times it deals with the thought life, the emotions, the wellsprings of life, those things that motivate and mold us. The Bible calls that the heart. I'm calling it the thought life.

The Majesty of the Thought Life

Why is the thought life so important? Why did Solomon tell his son, "Keep thy heart with all diligence; for out of it are the issues of life?" Because the thought life controls the rest of your life.

If you tell me what you think, I'll tell you who you are and the life you live. What you think is what you are. The thought life controls you. "As a man thinketh in his heart, so is he" (Proverbs 23:7).

Your thoughts—positive, negative, good, or bad—control your attitudes. Your attitudes are the sum total of your thoughts. Your attitudes lead to your actions.

The Thought Is the Father of the Deed

All good psychologists will tell you that. Someone once said, "Sow a thought, reap a deed. Sow a deed, reap a habit. Sow a habit, reap a character. Sow a character, reap a destiny."

What Are You Going to Achieve in Life?

Before you can do a thing you have to think it. Your thoughts lead to attitudes; attitudes lead to actions; actions lead to those achievements. It all begins with the thought life. Your achievements will be the sum total of your thoughts.

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in complaining, gossip, disputes, and contention. Believers are instructed many times to avoid grumbling, murmuring, and complaining (Exodus 16:3; John 6:43; Philippians 2:14). By engaging in these activities, believers shift their focus away from the plans, purposes, and past blessings of God to the things of the world. God sees this as a lack of faith, and without faith, it is impossible to please God (Hebrews 11:6). Instead, Christians are instructed to strive for contentment in all things, trusting in God to provide what is needed in His good time (Hebrews 13:5). **Guarding against a complaining spirit and cultivating a spirit of gratitude and trust is the second step toward guarding the heart.**

Congestive heart failure is an inability of the heart to successfully pump blood through the body due to weaknesses within its walls. Congestive heart failure can result from hypertension (high blood pressure), myocardial infarctions (heart attacks), and abnormal enlargement of the heart. The spiritual equivalents are anger, lying, deceit, giving in to temptation, pride, and any other sin that is not repented of.

Anger acts like a poison on the body, both physically and spiritually, and makes a believer more vulnerable to the temptation to hurt others with our actions and words. Ephesians 4:31–32 instructs, “Let all bitterness, and wrath, and anger, and clamour, and evil speaking, be put away from you, with all malice: And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ’s sake hath forgiven you.”

Every Christian is locked in a constant, intense war with demonic forces. Many of us become so intent on fighting the external spiritual war that we forget that much of our battle is not

with external forces, but with our own mind and thoughts. James 1:14–16 tells us, “But every man is tempted, when he is drawn away of his own lust, and enticed. Then when lust hath conceived, it bringeth forth sin: and sin, when it is finished, bringeth forth death. Do not err, my beloved brethren.”



Sin always begins in the mind. A sinner must first conceive and dwell on the sinful action before he actually carries it out. The first

line of defense, therefore, must be to refuse to even contemplate a wrongful action. The apostle Paul tells us to take every thought captive, so that it conforms to the will of God (2 Corinthians 10:3–5).

Proverbs 16:18 tells us that pride leads to destruction. Proverbs 16:5, says, “Every one that is proud in heart is an abomination to the Lord: though hand join in hand, he shall not be unpunished.” Pride was the first great sin of Satan, when he thought that he could be like God and incited one third of the angels to attempt a coup in heaven (Ezekiel 28:17). For this reason, Satan was cast from heaven. Satan also tempted Eve in the Garden of Eden by appealing to her ego. Eve desired to be as wise as God, so she capitulated to Satan’s advice to eat of the fruit of the tree. Pride was the downfall of man, as well. Satan did not want man to obey God but to become his own god—determining for himself reality, meaning, and ethics. This satanic philosophy is the foundational philosophy of sorcery, secular humanism, and New Age mysticism.

Avoiding anger, pride, and temptation are also critical elements of guarding the heart. The apostle Paul instructs us, “Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things.” (Philippians 4:8). Dwelling on these things will help to build a guard fence around our hearts. ■

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This is so fundamental that God destroyed an entire civilization because they had “heart trouble.”

“And God saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every imagination of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually.” (Genesis 6:5)

God said, “The thoughts of their heart are so evil, I’m going to have to destroy them,” and He sent the flood because of the thoughts of men’s hearts. The heart of the human problem is the problem of the human heart. We’re still having the same problem they had.

The Mastery of the Thought Life

“And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.” (Romans 12:2)

When God gets ready to change someone, how does He do it? By changing how they think. God changes the thought process.

What Solomon said to his son was, “Son, guard, protect, and be careful of your thought life. Keep your heart with all diligence; for out of it are the issues of life.” The Lord Jesus Christ wants us to present our bodies to Him, including our minds, that He might transform us. No wonder the devil battles for the mind. How important that we learn to keep our hearts, because a fierce battle is raging for the control of your mind.

When God is in the heart, then we think right, live right, do right. When God is absent, we think wrong, do wrong, live wrong.

How Am I Going to Guard My Thought Life?

Be careful what comes into your mind. You have to think pure thoughts. Now, a text without a context is a pretext, so context is important. In this passage Solomon is talking about the sexual affairs of a young man. Solomon is warning his son about having impure, immoral thoughts in his heart and life.

Let me tell you something wonderful. God made

you where you can’t think two things at one time. So how do you keep from thinking what’s wrong? Just think what’s right. And if you’re thinking what’s right, you cannot be thinking what’s wrong.

It’s another way of saying, “Just load up on My Word. Get My Word into your heart.”

“Wherewithal shall a young man cleanse his way? By taking heed thereto according to Thy Word. With my whole heart have I sought Thee: O let me not wander from Thy commandments. Thy Word have I hid in my heart that I might not sin against Thee.” (Psalm 119:9-11)

Store Up on the Word of God

How are you going to think pure thoughts? By thinking positive thoughts. Not thinking about flowers and birds and trees, but the mighty Word of God. “The Word of God is quick and powerful, and sharper than a two-edged sword” (Hebrews 4:12). Get it in your heart. It has power to cleanse and keep you.

The Ministry of the Thought Life

From your thought life and through your thought life God wants to minister to you. A God-controlled thought life will— Govern your speech (v. 24); Guard your sight (v. 25) and; Guide your steps (v. 27)

If you want to know what is in your heart, just listen to what escapes your mouth. Jesus said, “Out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaketh” (Matthew 12:34). As they say in the country, “What’s down in the well comes up in the bucket.”

When your mind is clear and right with God, when you think the thoughts of Christ after Him, when you have the mind of Christ, when you’re being transformed by the word of God and the power of God and the Spirit of God in your thought life, then you’re going to be doing the will of God.

God has a plan for you, a wonderful plan. The book of Proverbs shows you His plan for having health, wealth, and wisdom. It begins in your thought life. ■

- Academic Balance (3 PACEs completed in each subject within the given quarter)


- Maintain an overall "B" average or higher for all classroom subjects.






