May God bless you all richly!



## Twenty-Four Helpful Thoughts On Rearing Children for God

The goal of every Christian parent in life should not be to rear a good kid or have students who are excelling academically, are great athletes, and so forth. The goal is to equip our children, these young saints for the work of the ministry (Ephesians 4:12, Mark 10:45). Our goal as Christian parents is to train them to stay on the road of usefulness to God. If, in the end, they are unusable to Christ, they are not handling life spiritually and wisely, both they and we have failed.



23:26. You must pray for this daily and work at it. Part of getting their heart is to ask questions. You must make time to communicate. You must draw out what is in the heart. Remember that if you lose your child's heart, find out where you lost it and make every effort to get it back as soon as possible. Your child's heart can be lost, hardened, and stolen. These are the three steps every child takes to rebellion. These steps are taken because the parents lose the heart of the child.

1. Make sure to encourage your children to read biographies and autobiographies of Christians of the past. As a young Christian I immersed myself in these books and they were a blessing to my life. We encouraged our children to read these books and it helped them to see how God had worked in other Christian's lives.

2. Make sure your children hear you pray, and in your prayer let them hear you calling their name to God. Teach your children how to pray.

3. Make sure you show your children how to do personal devotions and that they see you read the Bible and do personal devotions. Make sure you read and explain the Bible to your children. Your personal, intimate, and real spiritual relationship with God will be the most important influence in rearing your children for God. The second will be conveying to your children the way to have that relationship and for them to have an intimate, personal, passionate relationship with the Lord.

4. The most important thing about rearing spiritual children is for the spiritual parent to get and keep the child's heart, Proverbs

5. Make sure you put God first in your life and giving. Make sure that you explain that all money is God's money, not just 10 percent. Make sure that you explain giving to the Lord to your children and that your children see you give to the Lord. As your children are given money or work for money, make sure they understand that giving begins at an early age.


6. Make sure your children see you submit yourself to the Holy Spirit. Encourage them to submit themselves to the Holy Spirit. As the Lord works in your life, it does not hurt these children to see you come forward in a service and submit yourself more fully to God.

7. Make sure you share your personal testimony of salvation with your children. Tell them how you got saved. Pray earnestly for your children to be saved and make sure they understand the gospel. Seek to see your children come to know Christ at an early age.

8. Make sure your children see you give out gospel tracts to others. Take them on visitation with you.

9. Make sure your children hear

you give a clear presentation of the gospel to an unsaved person. Teach your children how to give that presentation.

10. Make sure your children hear you tell others how much your local church means to you. Make sure they understand the importance of faithful church attendance, 1 Corinthians 4:2, Hebrews 10:25.

11. Make sure your children hear you and your wife tell each other that you love each other.

12. Make sure your children hear you express gratitude to God for His blessing in your life and family.

13. Make sure you tell your children you love

them often and consistently.

14. Make sure you explain Bible truths to your children and make practical application of that truth in the daily activities of life.

15. Make sure you explain the great doctrinal truths of the Bible to your children. It is very important to explain how the Holy Spirit works in your life. Explain what it means to be filled (controlled by the Holy Spirit).

16. Make sure you are attending a good sound Bible preaching and teaching church. Make sure the emphasis of the church is upon growing spiritually, winning the lost, and not activity orientation. Do

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## Does It Pay to Do Right Anymore?



If the Bible is being thrown out, it is no wonder that the idea of doing right because it is right is too.

But let me add to the question: "Does it pay to do the right thing when no one else will ever know about it?" Does it pay to return extra change when the cashier gives you too much? If anything, you lose money. Does it pay to tell the truth when there may be dire consequences to doing so—losing your job, for instance?

If we were honest with ourselves, most of us would probably agree that we are more likely to do the right thing only if there is something in it for us. I mean, doesn't life teach us that it is crazy to do otherwise? Scandal after scandal, fraud after fraud, it has actually paid not to do the right thing. That is, until the person gets caught.

Why do so many think this way? Why do Americans tend to look after themselves and do what would benefit the individual? As much as we don't like to admit it, "good, old-fashioned values" are becoming just that. Old-fashioned.

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In a world of Skype, YouTube, Twitter, and Facebook, everyone can know what you're doing when you do it. Your life can go viral. Depending on what and when you post, you can become famous, garnering an army of fans and being asked to appear on talk shows or speak, sing, or play at events. You could be the next American icon.

With such exposure, **it does pay to do the right thing.** If you are discovered. If someone finds out about your heroic—or just nice—deed and blogs about it, tweets it, or in some way documents it for the masses, you could be paid well for "going above and beyond the call of duty." And I am in no way denigrating those who have been recognized for their good deeds. Many times, they have been highly deserving of recognition.

### Why?

Well, we've thrown out the rule book. In demoting the Bible to the status of "good literature," in taking the Ten Commandments out of public places, and in relegating the names of God and Jesus Christ to words sworn in frustration, we are creating a generation of new rules. Everything is tolerated—everything, of course, except Christian principles.

The idea of doing right with no promise of immediate or public reward originated with the Bible. Take Joseph, for example: he did right and was punished for it. At least for a while. If the Bible is being thrown out, it is no wonder that the idea of doing right because it is right is too.

### So what is the answer?

There is no easy fix for a collective mindset that has devolved over several generations—and that has spiked in its devolution over the last few decades. We must first realize that we are broken before we can begin to fix ourselves. Will the change happen with the millennial generation? As the Bible says, "With God all things are possible" (Matthew 19:26; Mark 10:27). With God, a rich man can be saved from eternal damnation, and a nation can be revived to thirst after the God it once spurned.

With God, we can revive this barren land. But change begins only when we decide to do the right thing, even when no one else will know—even if no one cares and there is no earthly reward.



sure to not allow your children to start concentrating on the opposite sex at an early age. Make sure you are the most important influence in your children's life.

18. Make sure you live a holy life separate from worldliness, evil, and ungodliness. Make sure your life is a testimony of holiness not only at church but home as well.

19. Make sure your children are educated in a Biblical, Godly, and Christian wholesome atmosphere. Do not be deceived that educating your children in the world's system (which is the devil's system) will not affect your children. Understand that many Christian Schools are not a spiritual and wholesome atmosphere.

20. Make sure you are seeking to develop Godly Christian character in your children's lives by proper discipline. A child must learn to obey the first time. A child must learn to never be told more than once to obey. Make sure to discipline correctly and consistently. Make sure you, as a parent, pay attention and work at proper discipline. It is your responsibility to teach your child how to concentrate. Make sure you always discipline improper attitude and reaction.

21. Make sure that you are not living your life daily in ungodly anger, or the spirit of anger. Ephesians 4:31-32. Most parents lose the heart of their children by using ungodly anger on them. Understand that the Bible says this will fail. He that soweth iniquity shall reap vanity: and the rod of his anger shall fail. Proverbs 22:8. Understand that the Bible says ungodly anger comes from pride, Proverbs 21:24. Many Christians are operating in their daily life under the impression they are in fellowship with God and in reality they are running their life in sinful anger out of fellowship with God, 1 John 1:6-10. Ungodly anger is deceptive and many Christians are deceived by it, Galatians 6:7-8. By doing this, we open up our life to the devil and his destruction, 1 Peter 5:8. This destruction takes place in our lives, in the lives of our family, and our children. The essence of the Christian life is to be controlled by the Spirit of God, Ephesians 5:18. We are not controlled by the Spirit of God if we live our life daily in ungodly anger. Satan is very deceptive and ungodly anger is designed by Satan to destroy your family and your life. Make sure you understand that love is kind, 1 Corinthians 13:4.

22. Make sure you understand

that you have to develop Godly character in the lives of your children. Their character is their destiny. The Bible gives at least 49 different character traits. The devil will get interested in their character and your character. He does not care about you or your children. He has three desires, to steal, kill, and to destroy, John 10:9-10. Realize you are fighting the devil for your children, 1 Peter 5:8. Make sure to have character discussions in your home. Learn to praise proper character in your children. (This may be the most important point). Proverbs 27:21. Generally, we do not praise our children or we praise the wrong things like beauty or achievement, which develops pride. Praising character in your children develops their accomplishments further without building pride.

23. Make sure you teach your children how to have an intimate, personal, and passionate relationship with God. A Spirit filled life is a submitted life, James 4:7. We cannot overemphasize the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives. Elmwood Baptist Academy students have the opportunity to go on a fun, all-day field trip to Boondocks at the end of October.


These honor roll field trips are privileges not rights and must be earned each quarter.

Requirements:

  - Maintain an overall "B" average or higher for all classroom subjects.
  - Memorize and quote the monthly scripture selections.
2. Pay the amount due for the field trip - \$25.00, including an all-you-can-eat lunch
3. We will leave at 9:30am on the day of the field trip and will return by 2:45pm.
4. Parents are welcome to come. Cost is the same as the students.



## Dress Code



Each student's appearance should be such that Christ would be pleased and honored. It is vital that each student wholeheartedly support the dress standards. No immodest dress is allowed. Clothing is immodest if, by its style, cut, coloration, or fit, hinders others from looking at your face. Some fads violate God's warning to keep male and female dress distinctly different. (Deut. 22:5) School dress code items are to be worn all week for academic work, for official school functions, on or off-campus. PLEASE, No outdated, dirty, wrinkled, or ragged clothing. The Bible only lays out three general principles for our dress. (1) Modesty is essential. (2) Offending others is a sin. (3) We need to dress in a way that honors and glorifies God and avoids the appearance of something evil.

These principles work wonderfully; however, problems arise when opinions differ as to what is modest, offends, or is honoring to God. Therefore, the following guidelines have been researched and determined as good, safe regulations on how our students should dress.

The following guidelines will be enforced...

### K-4 through 12th Level Boys

- **Pants:**
  - Navy Blue, Black, Dark Grey or Khaki dress pants in good condition. A solid black or brown belt must be worn with pants.
  - **Exception:** K-4 and K-5 students do not need to wear a belt.

- All belt buckles must be approved through the office.
- **Shirts:**
  - Collared, loose-fitting, two to four-button, solid color polo shirt of any color. No logos other than the Elmwood Baptist Church or Academy logos will be permitted on the polo shirts.
  - Shirt must be buttoned up excluding the top button at all times.
  - No undershirt or undergarment can be revealed in anyway, excluding turtle-necks and long-sleeve shirts.
- **Shoes:**
  - Dress shoes or boots that are solid black, brown, or navy blue must be worn in the classroom. Boys' shoes that reflect a feminine style and heel will not be permitted.
  - No athletic shoes or casual shoes will be permitted to be worn.
  - Athletic shoes may be worn to P.E. only.
  - No casual shoes, such as Vans, Converse, or other brands may be worn.
  - No shoes with any tears or rips are to be worn.
  - Shoes must be neat and polished.
  - **Exception for K-4 and K-5 Classrooms:** Athletic shoes or casual shoes are permitted to be worn.
- **Boy's P.E. Uniform (4th-12th level):**
  - Grey t-shirt
  - Loose-fitting sweat pants or athletic pants or loose-fitting shorts that fall below the knee.
  - White ankle socks
  - Non-marking athletic shoes
- **General Rules:**
  - No faded, dirty, wrinkled, or unprofessional clothing may be worn at any time.
  - Jackets and coats with no logos or

- emblems may be worn in the classroom.
- No pullover "hoodie" jackets are permitted.
- No jewelry (necklace, bracelet, earrings) or apparel that might suggest a feminine appearance may be worn.
- Hair is to be cut and neatly groomed at all times.
- Long hair that comes down over or touches the ears or collar will not be permitted.
- Hair is not to fall down over the eyebrows or eyes no matter which way it is combed or styled.
- Haircuts should be tapered.
- No trendish cuts, such as bowl cut, Mohawks, "fauxhawks, spiked hair" etc. are permissible.
- Boys are not to wear sunglasses, hats, or caps in the school /church buildings.
- No facial hair or sideburns
- Backpacks must not promote any movies, music groups, actors, teen or adult icons or other worldly influential items. All backpacks must fit inside the locker.
- Lunch boxes or pails must not promote any movies, music groups, actors, teen or adult icons or other worldly influential items.

### K-4 through 12th Level Girls

- Skirts:**
  - A modest, loose-fitting skirt (no culottes), the length needs to be to mid-calf.
  - No denim material is permitted. No jean skirts of any sort.
  - Loose-fitting jumpers may be worn in lieu of a skirt.
- Shirts:**
  - Collared, loose-fitting, two to four-button, solid color polo shirt of any color. No logos other than the Elmwood Baptist Academy logo will be permitted on

- the polo shirts.
- Shirt must be buttoned up excluding the top button at all times.
- No undershirt or undergarment can be revealed in anyway, excluding turtle-necks and long-sleeve shirts.
- Turtle-necks and long-sleeve undershirts must be the exact same color as the outer shirt.
- T-shirts, form-fitting clothing, see-through shirts, and dresses or skirts with slits above the bottom of the knee are not allowed.
- Shirts that reveal in any way, including revealing the outline of, any undergarment are not permitted.

### **Shoes:**

- Dress shoes or boots that are solid black, brown, or navy blue must be worn in the classroom.
- No athletic shoes or casual shoes will be permitted to be worn.
- No sandals, or open-toed shoes, of any type, are permitted to be worn.
- No casual shoes, such as Vans, Converse, or other brands may be worn.
- No shoes with any tears or rips are to be worn.
- Shoes must be neat and polished.
- Exception for K-4 and K-5 Classrooms:** Athletic shoes or casual shoes are permitted to be worn.

### **Girl's P.E. Uniform (4th-12th level):**

- Grey t-shirt
- Loose-fitting sweat pants or athletic pants, culottes, skorts, or loose-fitting shorts that fall below the knee.
- White ankle socks
- Non-marking athletic shoes


### **General Rules:**

- No faded, dirty, wrinkled, or unprofessional clothing may be worn at any time.
- Jackets and coats with no logos or emblems may be worn in the classroom.
  - No pullover

jackets are permitted.

- Dress shoes must be worn in the classroom.
- No excessive amount of make-up.
- Makeup must be lightly applied and must match the natural skin tone.
- No bright colors of any makeup may be worn as this draws attention to oneself and not to God.
- No makeup may be worn by any student under the age of 14 years old.
- Only one earring is permitted in each ear on the lobe of the ear. No dangling earrings, or earrings in locations that are outside of the lobe.
- Hairstyles are to be such as is becoming to a Christian girl. All hair colors and

- styles must be natural, no streaking or un-natural colors will be permitted. Hair should not hang over the face.
- Hair is not to fall down over the eyebrows or eyes no matter which way it is combed or styled.
- Backpacks must not promote any movies, music groups, actors, teen or adult icons or other worldly influential items. Backpacks must fit inside the locker.
- Lunch boxes or pails must not promote any movies, music groups, actors, teen or adult icons or other worldly influential items.
- No hats are to be worn inside the building at anytime.



## Preschool (2-3 yrs) Boys

- Navy Blue, Black, Dark Grey or Khaki pants in good condition.
- Collared, loose-fitting, two to four-button, solid color polo shirt of any color. No logos other than the Elmwood Baptist Church or Academy logos will be permitted on the polo shirts.
- Shirt must be buttoned up excluding the top button at all times.
- No undershirt or undergarment can be revealed in anyway, excluding turtle-necks and long-sleeve shirts.
- No pullover jackets are permitted.
- Dress shoes or solid black, brown, or navy blue casual shoes as well as athletic shoes may be worn in the classroom. Boys' shoes that reflect a feminine style and heel will not be permitted.
- No jewelry (necklace, bracelet, earrings) or apparel that might suggest a feminine appearance may be worn.
- Hair is to be cut and neatly groomed at all times.
- Long hair that comes down over the ears or collar or touches the ears or collar will not be permitted.
- Hair is not to fall down over the eyebrows or eyes no matter which way it is combed or styled.
- Haircuts should be tapered.
- No trendish cuts, such as bowl cut, Mohawks, "fauxhawks," etc. are permissible.
- Backpacks must not promote any movies, music groups, actors, teen or adult icons or other worldly influential items.
- Lunch boxes or pails must not promote any movies, music groups, actors, teen or adult icons or other worldly influential items.
- **\*\*Please bring an extra set of school dress code clothing for the teacher to keep on hand in the event of any accident at school.**

## Preschool (2-3 yrs) Girls

- A modest, loose-fitting skirt (no culottes), the length needs to be to mid-calf. Jumpers that extend to mid-calf are acceptable.
- Collared, loose-fitting, two to four-button, polo shirt of any color(s). No logos other than the Elmwood Baptist Academy logo will be permitted on the polo shirts.
- Shirt must be buttoned up excluding the top button at all times.
- No undershirt or undergarment can be revealed in anyway, excluding turtle-necks and long-sleeve shirts.
- Dresses that cover the shoulders and fall at least 3 inches on the arm as well as below the knees can be used in place of the polo shirt.
- Solid colored jackets and coats with no logos or emblems may be worn in the classroom.
- No pullover jackets are permitted.
- Dress shoes or solid black, brown, or navy blue casual shoes must be worn in the classroom. No boots of any kind are permitted to be worn in the classrooms.
- No open-toed shoes or sandals may be worn.
- No makeup may be worn at anytime.
- Only one earring is permitted in the lobe of each ear. No dangling earrings, studs only.
- Hairstyles are to be such as is becoming to a Christian girl. All hair colors and styles must be natural, no streaking or un-natural colors will be permitted. Hair should not hang over the face.
- **\*\*Parents, your child will be wearing a dress or a skirt, please have them wear shorts underneath.**
- **\*\*Please bring an extra set of school dress code clothing for the teacher to keep on hand in the event of any accident at school.**
